MEDiC students talked about their volunteer activities among the Madison's underserved populations at the University of Wisconsin Foundation board of directors annual meeting.

Pat Turski, MD, will serve as principal investigator for a NIH R21 grant (\$386,618) to develop Functional Magnetic Resonance Angiography (fMRA). Co-investigators on the project include

Professors Charles Mistretta, Yjing Wu, Howard Rowley, Beverly Aagaard-Keinitz, David Niemann, Richard Bruce, Kevin Johnson and Julia Velikina. fMRA is a highly accelerated MRA technique that provides a series of time-resolved whole brain MR angiograms as well as physiological information such as velocity vector plots, flow streamlines, volume flow rates, pressure gradients and estimates of shear stress.
